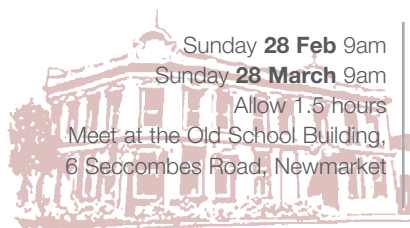
Grafton

Tour around historic Grafton and identify some of the early houses of the area and structures such as the Grafton Bridge and cemetery. This walk gives background on some of Grafton's heritage buildings, both residential and public, and its illustrious residents. There are many pauses en route to discuss points of interest.

Judges Bay

Discover geological aspects of the Maori and European history of the area. Hear about the early Maori settlement, Maori hospital and the site where Bishop Selwyn landed in New Zealand. Other highlights: a 20-million year old lahar flow, the location of the TEAL flying boat operation and the St George's Rowing Club.

Streams and Gullies
